Goal #1

State Goal

Students at Book Cliff Elementary will increase proficiency in both Acadience Reading and Math by 20% from the BOY assessment to the EOY assessment in the 2023-2024 school year. Students will also increase proficiency on the RISE math, ELA, and science assessments by 3% when compared to the 2023 results.

Book Cliff Elementary's 2022 RISE ELA assessment showed that 30% of 3rd-6th graders scored proficient. In the Acadience Reading 2023 middle of the year testing, 2023 testing, 44.8% of students K-6 are on or above grade level in reading. These assessments are indicators that reading continues to be a critical need at Book Cliff. ELA is continually the most critical academic need at Book Cliff Elementary. Our students' reading ability directly impacts all other subject areas; therefore, the council has chosen to focus on reading skills across all subjects. The end-of-year summative RISE assessment and the Acadience Reading benchmarks will measure growth.

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

- 1. Professional development will be provided for teachers to increase teaching capacity and improve tier-one instruction.
- 2. Assemblies will be scheduled to motivate, educate, and address academic barriers among our student body.
- 3. Authors will be invited to the school to model great reading and writing abilities. In addition, these authors will hold student workshops with each grade level.
- 4. Acadience reading data and progress monitoring data will be reviewed in grade-level PLCs and school team meetings. In addition, RTI groups will be formed and students will be placed in targeted intervention groups.
- 5. Acadience reading BOY, MOY, and EOY assessments will be given and progress monitoring for all students. progress monitoring frequency will be dependent on student scores.
- 6. The Really Great Reading program will be taught in K-3 and in reading intervention groups.
- 7. Lexia Core 5, SRI, Vocabulary City, Skill Struck, IXL, and DreamBox computer programs will identify reading gaps, increase spelling and vocabulary, and practice reading skills among students K-6.
- 8. Book Cliff's Constitution Bee, art and science fair will continue as a way to improve reading across all subjects and showcase student work with all stakeholders.
- 9. UEN science books, Mystery Science, and Generation Genius will be purchased to increase academic vocabulary and provide the necessary science materials for all Book Cliff students.
- 10. Chromebooks and other necessary technology supplies will be purchased to continue our one-to-one technology ratio.
- 11. Books will be purchased for all students and will be given to students at our Breakfast with Books event as a way to support literacy at home.
- 12. Overnight accommodations will be provided for presenters, teachers, and staff to participate in professional development opportunities.
